RAFFMA CELEBRATES INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM DAY

SAN BERNARDINO, Calif. —RAFFMA, the Robert and Frances Fullerton Museum of Art at CSUSB, will join other museums around the world on Wednesday, May 18, in celebrating International Museum Day.

RAFFMA will stay open later than usual with hours from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Recognizing this year's theme, "Museums and Memory," RAFFMA will give away free T-shirts to any visitors who leave a "memory" at the front desk. Additionally, museum director Eva Kirsch will present a free lecture on understanding the role museums play in preserving antiquities. The lecture begins at 5:30 p.m. and is open to the public. Parking is \$5.

RAFFMA plays a vital role in the community, presenting the art and culture of other civilizations and preserving their memories for future generations. International Museum Day will be an occasion for museum visitors to not only rediscover their own memories, but also realize the memories of those from a different time and place.

The International Council of Museums established International Museum Day in 1977 to encourage public awareness on the role of museums in the development of society. Momentum has been rising unabated ever since. In 2010, International Museum Day has garnered record-breaking participation, with almost 30,000 museums hosting events in more than 95 countries.
